

No compensation, no vote: 'Dahiya chaubisi'

SONEPAT, APRIL 8 Enraged over the laying of high-tension wires in fields, members of the 'Dahiya chaubisi', a group of 24 villages of Dahiya khap, announced that they would a keep distance from all political parties in the upcoming elections and mounted posters and banners at various places, banning the entry of political leaders in their villages.

They wrote 'no compensation, no vote' on banners.

They have also given a call for amahapanchayat on April 11 at Nahra village, in which khap leaders and SKM leaders

would participate.

Umesh Dahiya, president of 'Dahiya chaubisi' and sarpanch, said it was decided in the panchayat of the 'chaubisi' villages at Nahra village yesterday.

Dahiya said a power grid line was being laid from Kuchh in Gujarat and high-transmission lines were being laid from Auchandi village of Delhi to Mahra village of Sonapat.

The farmers were demanding compensation for land at market rates. However, the company refused their demand, following which they staged a protest against the company, which lodged FIRs against the farmers.

Untimely rain, hail may drop wheat yield by 20% in Rohtak

The yield of wheat crop in the district is expected to decline by up to 20 per cent as compared to the last rabi season.

Agriculture Department officials attribute the decline to the untimely rainfall and hailstorm that lashed the region in the month of March. As per official sources, the area under wheat cultivation in the district was 1.03 lakh hectares in 2022-23, and the average yield of wheat was 41.70 quintals per hectare.

The area under wheat cultivation in the district increased to 1.04 lakh hectares in 2023-24, but the average yield of wheat is likely to be about 33 quintals per hectare this year, indicating a decline of nearly 20 per cent.

"The untimely rain and hailstorm in March caused damage to standing wheat crop in the district, due to which the yield is expected to decline," said Rakesh Kumar, Quality Control

Inspector of the department.

Meanwhile, farmers are facing a shortage of migrant workers for harvesting wheat as a number of casual labourers from Bihar, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and other states have gone to their villages for certain auspicious ceremonies. Hence, the combined harvester machines are in big demand.

"Till a few years ago, local farmers used to harvest the crops themselves, along with their family members. However, they have now become dependent on migrant workers or combined harvesters," says Krishan, a young farmer of Ritoli village.

On the other hand, the arrival of wheat has started at the grain markets in the district, but the procurement is slow due to the high moisture content in the produce. Wheat purchase is likely to pick up in the coming days.

Two more persons have been arrested in connection with the case of misusing the login ID and password of the Assistant Returning Officer (ARO) in the Kurukshetra Lok Sabha constituency for rejecting the Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP's) application for permission to hold a public meeting, with derogatory remarks and abusive language.

Earlier, two persons had been arrested in the case, said DSP Gurvinder Singh. Two applications of an AAP leader, who had sought permission for two programmes of AAP candidate Sushil Gupta to be held on April 7, had been rejected.

The accused have been identified as Shivang, Parveen and Ashish, all residents of Radhaswami Colony Kaithal, and Vishal

of Teontha village in the Kaithal district.

The DSP said as per the complaint of the Assistant Returning Officer, applications regarding permission for public meeting were received through the online portal on April 3.

An unknown person misused his ID, cancelled the application forms and uploaded objectionable comments and photos.

A case was registered in this regard.

Shivang and Praveen were arrested on Saturday, while Ashish and Vishal were arrested today. Two mobile phones were also recovered from them. They have been sent to judicial custody.

Investigation revealed that they had reportedly done so from the residence of Shivang, who managed to obtain the login ID password during an election training session.

1.2K complaints over model code violation resolved: Poll officer

Urges people to cooperate in conducting fair elections

State Chief Electoral Officer Anurag Agarwal has said people are also keeping a close watch through cVigil mobile app regarding violations of the model code of conduct. Through the innovative app, people are empowered to actively monitor and report violations of the code, ensuring fair and transparent elections.

Agarwal said so far, 1,204 complaints had been received on the app in the state, which had been resolved within a specified time. The public ensuring their participation in the system through the app was a matter of pride.

Providing district-wise details, he said the highest complaints — 317 — had been received from Sirsa district, 219 from Ambala, 46 from Bhiwani, 40 from

Faridabad, 37 from Fatehabad, 78 from Gurugram, 46 from Hisar, 20 from Haryana, 22 each from Jind and Kaithal, 16 from Karnal, 31 from Kurukshetra, three from Mahendragarh, 36 from Mewat, 32 from Palwal, 67 from Panchkula, five from Panipat, three from Rewari, 34 from Rohtak, 87 from Sonapat, and 43 from Yamunanagar.

Among these, 959 complaints were found to be valid and action was taken accordingly.

Complaints would be resolved within 100 minutes of registration.

Flying squads and static surveillance teams had real-time information and teams would immediately reach the location from where the complaint was received.

Online permission for campaign activities

The Election Commission has launched several mobile apps and portals, facilitating parties and candidates.

Through Suvidha portal (<https://suvidha.eci.gov.in>), online permission is being provided for campaign activities. So far, 207 requests have been received from parties and candidates. It caters to permissions for organising rallies, opening temporary party offices, door-to-door canvassing, video vans, helicopters, vehicle permits, and distribution of pamphlets.

Parties and candidates can seamlessly submit permission requests from anywhere, at any time. Additionally, offline submission options are available to ensure inclusivity and equal opportunity to all.

Suvidha also has a companion app that enables applicants to track the status of their requests in real time, adding further convenience and transparency to the process. — TNS

HC rings in new system for foreign nationals in jails to contact kin

Foreign nationals lodged in jails across Haryana, Punjab and Chandigarh may soon be able to contact their families, with the Punjab and Haryana High Court making clear its intent to ring in a new system for them to telephonically contact their kin back home, at least once a month.

Dialling up a fresh approach to ensure that they remained within reach of their families, a Division Bench today initiated suo motu proceedings in public interest. It followed a request made by a Kenyan national during Acting Chief Justice Gurmee Singh Sandhawalia's inspection of a central jail (women).

Justice Sandhawalia was told during the inspection that a system was not in place for foreign nationals lodged in jails to get in touch with their family after their arrest. "We are of the considered opinion that a larger human rights issue arises, which needs to be addressed by both the States of Punjab and Haryana to put in some policy/regulations to ensure that at least once a

month, foreign nationality convicts/under trials are able to get in touch with their family members by way of phone calls/video calls, which are to be arranged by the jail authorities," the Bench of Justices Sandhawalia and Lapita Banerji stated.

The Bench issued notice to Haryana and Punjab, along with the UT of Chandigarh, through the Home Secretary. Haryana Additional Advocate General and his Punjab counterpart accepted the notice on behalf of the states during the court proceedings.

To boost voting percentage, 8.5L F'bad residents take pledge
